## 1) CALL TO ORDER REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING AT 5:30 P.M.THIS 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 2020

Mayor Gary Chumley recognized and thanked Police Officer Jimmy Daniel for his twenty years with the Gatesville Police Department and congratulated him on his new position with Coryell County as Precinct 3 Constable. Officer Daniel said that it was an honor to serve the citizens of Gatesville and was looking forward to serving all of Coryell County as a Constable.

## 5) <u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE MINUTES FROM THE REGULAR</u> CITY COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 10, 2020

<u>RESOLUTION 2020-91</u>: Motion by Barbara Burrow, seconded by Meredith Rainer, to approve the Minutes from the Regular City Council Meeting November 10, 2020; all six voting "Aye", motion passed.

## 6) <u>BRIEFING REGARDING KEEP GATESVILLE BEAUTIFUL ORGANIZATION– CHAIRMAN JOE CAMPBELL</u>

Mayor Chumley pulled the Keep Gatesville Beautiful briefing from the agenda as Chairman Joe Campbell was unable make the meeting tonight. This item will be put on a future agenda.

#### 7) <u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE CITY OF GATESVILLE</u> <u>AUDITING FIRM ONE YEAR AGREEMENT OPTION WITH LOTT, VERNON, & COMPANY,</u> <u>P.C. FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020 AUDIT SERVICES</u>

City Manager Parry said that Lott, Vernon, & Company had completed the three base years stipulated in their contract with the City of Gatesville and that based on their excellent performance recommended Council approve the first of a two year option clause.

<u>RESOLUTION 2020-92</u>: Motion by Greg Casey, seconded by Jack Doyle, to approve the City of Gatesville auditing firm one year agreement option with Lott, Vernon, & Company P.C. for Fiscal Year 2020 audit services; all six voting "Aye", motion passed.

#### 8) CITY MANAGER'S REPORT:

City Manager Parry explained that traditionally the Department Head reports are only included in the read –ahead packets for the second meeting of the month but since there was only one meeting in November and only one scheduled in December (due to the holidays) the reports that would have been included for those two meetings are included in this meeting's books.

- 1. Other activities/dates of note:
- February 27, 2021: Household Hazardous Waste event at the Civic Center in conjunction with a "City Wide Cleanup" sponsored by Keep Gatesville Beautiful. Parry encouraged the Council to participate.
- City Holidays: December 24th and December 25th for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day; January 1st for New Year's Day.
- Trash pickup schedules will be adjusted and city staff will spread the word on the temporary schedule.
- 2. <u>BUDGET/FINANCIAL REPORT:</u> Parry summarized the cash balances in the General Fund, Water & Sewer Fund, and unassigned General Fund Reserve and stated that the City is in good financial position. Parry highlighted and discussed the reconciled financial statements for October and the quarterly investment report for the new councilmembers so they would become familiar with these monthly and quarterly reports.

Parry said that the bonds that were used for the Phase II expansion of the Water Treatment Plant in 2011 will mature in 2036 and are being considered for refunding under the recommendation of the City's financial advisor. The financial advisor said that refunding the bonds could save the city approximately \$1.5 million in debt service. The financial advisor is working the specifics of this process and will possibly be brought to the Council in January for consideration.

- 3. TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT FUND GRANT REQUEST REGARDING THE DRAINAGE STUDY: The City submitted a successful TWDB Flood Infrastructure Fund grant/loan request for \$250,000 to fund a drainage study and master plan for the City. The City's application has been funded with a grant of \$225,000 and a loan/cash match of \$25,000. The drainage study encompasses the City of Gatesville and the Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) of Gatesville -which is land located within one mile of the city limits. Gatesville belongs to the Leon River Coryell Creek Watershed but the City's drainage study only needs to include Gatesville and the ETJ. The issue has become that the TWDB recommends that Gatesville's drainage study should include the whole 373 square miles of the Leon River Coryell Creek Watershed or the grant may not get funded. The process to include the whole watershed would be a two year effort and very expensive project. FEMA has already flood modeled the Leon River and it is not needed for the drainage study that Gatesville is desperately needing. Parry said that he is working to resolve this issue and has a request into FEMA to see if they have anything that could assist staff with this problem.
- 4. <u>COVID-19 UPDATE</u>: City Manager Parry presented a Power Point program which highlighted:
  - The steady increase of positive Coronavirus cases, recoveries & fatalities both in the city limits of Gatesville and in the ETJ.

- Daily new Coronavirus cases in Texas as of December 7, 2020 = 8,712 and fatalities = 22,627

The Coronavirus spending plan was briefed/updated regarding the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Funding and what was available to cities. Gatesville allocation is \$884,290. Parry discussed the category of expenses and eligible costs and percentage allocation:

75% must be spent on medical, public health, and payroll expenses for employees substantially dedicated to mitigating COVID-19.

25% may be spent on expenses providing economic support and any other COVID-19 related expenses necessary to the functions of government.

There was a lengthy discussion on funding that had already been used and also discussed the plans to purchase qualified requests for unused funds.

- 7. <u>NEW COUNCILMEMBER ORIENTATION</u>: New Councilmember Orientation for the newly-elected members (incumbents are welcome to attend) is yet to be scheduled but possible orientation dates will be decided soon.
